STANDING ORDER OF THE COURT IN DOMESTIC RELATION CASES

The purpose of this Order is to mandate the preservation of the status quo with either-par having the right to a prompt hearing to have the Standing Order vacated or modified.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

- 1. Neither party shall injure, threaten or harass the other, or encourage or solicit other persons to so act.
- If property rights are at issue except in the ordinary course of business, neither party shall sell, agree to sell, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose or destroy any of the property to which the parties own an interest. Neither party may cancel or interfere with any insurance agreement which affect the opposite spouse or minor children.
- If the rights or custody of children are at issue, neither party shall remove, or consent to the removal of any child of the parties from the State of Arkansas without prior permission of this Court or consent of the opposing party. Neither party shall make disparaging remarks to the children about the other party nor permit such remarks to be made by others in the presence of the children.

NOTICE

The willful violation of this Order may result in punishment by fine or imprisonment, or both. This Order shall be in effect against plaintiff upon filing of the Complaint and effective against the defendant when served.
